MULTI-award winning Lonsdale electronics firm Redarc has been named one of Australia's top 20 Businesses of Tomorrow by Westpac.

As part of its BoT program, Westpac will today recognise 200 of the nation's most outstanding companies at a summit in Sydney.

The top 20 have been given the opportunity to participate in a mentor-matching program with Australian business leaders such as fashion designer Carla Zampatti and AGL chief executive Andrew Vesey.

Redarc, South Australia's sole listing in the top 20, will be mentored by Deloitte's chief operating officer David Hill.

The company, led by managing director Anthony Kittel, services industries such as heavy trucking, defence and agriculture. It also researches, develops and manufactures a range of electronic products and technologies.
