

Healthcare win for SA software developer

AN Adelaide software developer of back-office healthcare products has picked up a \$68 million tender to support improved care responsiveness and healthcare outcomes across Queensland.

The 10-year deal, in partnership with Sunquest Information Systems, will see PowerHealth provide laboratory related software solutions for Queensland Health services, covering 124 hospitals, 70 primary health centres and clinics, 17 aged-care facilities and 33 extreme remote multipurpose health services.

PowerHealth's healthcare billing application, PowerBilling and Revenue Collection, will provide the billing component for Queensland's pathology laboratory information system, with a focus on the elimination of revenue leakage and delivering billing efficiencies across all pathology disciplines.
