

Myriota in fleet partnership with Qld tech company

SA satellite maker Myriota is partnering with a Queensland technology company on a new fleet and asset tracking device.

Myriota's satellite connectivity will power Future Fleet International's new NX-01 tracking solution, which will be launched later this year.

It will be offered to Future Fleet's customers across agriculture, mining, and logistics and transport as a more reliable and cost-effective tracking solution to complement traditional cellular-based GPS tracking devices, especially in remote and isolated areas. Future Fleet wants to cut asset tracking costs by more than 50 per cent, and NX-01 will accelerate that process while strengthening service, security and battery life for its customers, Myriota said.

"Together, we're creating an opportunity to not only rapidly advance the capabilities of the transport and logistics sector at large, but also lower the sector's carbon footprint through optimised routes and reduced fuel consumption," Myriota chief Alex Grant said.

Future Fleet general manager Richard Saad said: "Our partnership with Myriota provides us with the capability to revolutionise how our customers track and manage their assets – allowing for a more reliable and cost-

effective technology across the board."
